


Your name is a light...

This weeks activity is to help you remember Jesus is the light of the world and whoever follows Him will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life. When you walk into a room with no windows & the lights are turned off can you see anything? What happens if you turn on the light switch? The darkness goes away right? This is how it is with Jesus. As a family read John 8:2 & John 3:16-21, discuss darkness & light. Who is the light in these verses? What is the darkness that people love instead of Jesus? When we are followers of Jesus and we walk with Him we want to stay far away from darkness and instead live in the love and the light of Jesus!

Now let's get started on this weeks activity: Light Switch Cover Craft

1. Measure the dimensions of a single switch light switch cover in your home.
2. Draw a rectangle of the same dimensions on a piece of blank white paper.
3. Draw a small rectangle in the center that will be cut out to fit over the actual switch.
4. They can decorate the rectangle and write: Jesus is the light.
5. Next cut out the large rectangle & the smaller hole for the switch.
6. Tape their paper cover over the light switch cover in their bedroom.
7. Remind them every time they turn on the light in their bedroom they will see the darkness disappear and they will remember that Jesus is the Light.



Additional questions to discuss throughout the week:

How can you shine your light so others can see Jesus in you?

What do you think would be some things people do on a playground or in sports that show they are following the light?

Is there anything in your life that you do that Jesus wouldn't like?

Does that feel like darkness?
